On Thursday, September 30th, we participated in Orange Shirt Day. On this day, we talked about how Canadians wear an orange shirt to demonstrate their commitment to reconciliation by opening and continuing the dialogue about residential schooling. We believe, as educators, it is important that students are aware of this, beginning in the early grades, and lessons focus on what it means 'to matter' and how all children matter in our communities, with a particular focus on Indigenous children and the impact of residential schools. All lessons have been

developed to allow for an age appropriate understanding of National Truth and Reconciliation Day.

Terry Fox School Run

On September 24th our students participated in the Terry Fox School Run. They walked or ran around the school grounds with their class as a whole school. It was great to see



everyone outside together! Thanks to everyone for the online donations this year! We raised just over \$1500!

Drop Off and Pick Up Procedures

If you are dropping off or picking up your child at the curb, please remain in your vehicle. Your child should only access the passenger side of the vehicle for safety purposes. If your child is too young to enter or exit the vehicle independently, please park in the Visitor parking lot and go to the crosswalk to receive or drop off your child.

Parents are asked to remain on the south side of the bus/vehicle lane at all times when dropping off or waiting for their child at the crosswalk. There is NO PARKING in or near the staff parking lot or near the dumpsters. These lots are labelled on the pavement. Please pass this information on to others who may be picking up or dropping off your child.

We also ask that you refrain from bringing dogs (or other pets) on to school property when picking up your child at the end of the day.

Halloween at Lyn PS

Although Halloween is on a Sunday this year, we are very happy to announce



that Halloween will be celebrated on Friday, October 29th at Lyn Public School! We know this is an exciting and fun time for our students so we will be having a whole school outdoor Halloween parade and teachers will be planning activities for their own classes. Please ensure you follow the COVID-19 protocols below so our



students can safely engage in our Halloween parade and activities:

- Students must wear their costumes to school and leave them on all day. Therefore, costumes should be comfortable.
- Students can choose to wear orange and black instead of a costume.
- Props or accessories may not accompany the costume. Please avoid a costume that has accessories that students will want to remove or parts that need to be removed for a student to sit.
- Masks will still need to be worn by students in Grades 1-6.
- The parade will occur outdoors, weather permitting, and follow social distancing measures.
- Students will remain with their class throughout the whole day.
- No food/candy may be brought to school for sharing or distribution.

Emergency Procedures

We have three emergency codes that we teach our students. Shelter in Place, Hold and Secure and Lockdown. We also practice fire drills three times in the fall and three times in the spring. We have reviewed these procedures with our students and we will continue to work with them in age-appropriate ways to help them understand why and when we use these codes. Similar to a 'Fire Drill', these codes must be understood and practised so that children know what to do in the event of an incident. When we practice our fire drills, we ensure that we are following safety procedures to minimize risk regarding COVID-19.

Bullying Prevention and Intervention

Bullying is defined as mean, aggressive, repeated behaviour that is intended to cause harm, fear or distress. This behaviour includes physical, verbal, electronic, written or other means. As part of our

school bullying prevention policy, the staff and students at Lyn use W.I.T.S. – a strategy that students can use to help with peer conflict. It provides a common language that children and adults at school can



use to talk about and respond to peer conflict in a positive way. We encourage students to always Seek Help from an adult if using their WITS is not effective.





Covid-19 Updates

Vaccine:

Health Unit clinics use mRNA vaccines (either Pfizer or Moderna) depending on availability of the vaccine). The province recommends Pfizer for age 12 to 17. Anyone 12+ (born in 2009 or earlier) is eligible for first dose.

- Second dose eligibility:
- Anyone 12+ (born in 2009 or earlier) who received Pfizer
 21 days ago



- o Anyone 18+ who received AstraZeneca 8 weeks ago
