The Hot Lunch and Milk Program is Back!

We are pleased to begin offering a hot lunch program and a milk program to our students again. This means that your child will have a choice of pizza and sub sandwich weekly and milk daily. We will be sending hot lunch and milk forms home with your child. You may do **one** of the following:

- 1) send in **exact** cash or cheque with the paper form
- 2) complete the online form and make an online payment using myfamilyroom.ca

IMPORTANT - Please complete and submit only one method (paper or online).

We are emphasizing the use of online payment through MyFamilyRoom and it is our plan to move to electronic payments only next year. Please visit myfamilyroom.ca if you have not yet enrolled.

Please note:

- If paying cash, send in the exact amount. There will be no change issued to you.
- We will follow the deadlines strictly with no exceptions made for late submissions.
- There will be no refunds if your child is absent on a hot lunch day.
- We will reschedule hot lunch delivery to the next school day if hot lunch falls on an inclement weather day (snow day).

Schools will be Open on Snow Days!

For the 2021-22 school year, when school transportation is cancelled due to poor weather conditions, UCDSB schools will remain open to staff and students.

Cancellation announcements will be made no later than 6:15 a.m. Parents/guardians can verify if transportation is cancelled by going to www.steo.ca, downloading the Bus Planner Delays App, checking STEO's social media sites or you can call STEO's inclement weather hotline at 1-866-629-0629 (updated no later than 6:15 a.m.). You can also go to UCDSB social media sites or Lyn PS's Facebook page. More detailed information about snow days can be found here on the UCDSB website.

Knowing that many students do not attend school on snow days, activities will be available on your child's classroom Microsoft Team, or in hard copy and sent home in advance. Your child's teacher will be in contact with you, with instructions on accessing these activities and expectations for inclement weather days, in the coming weeks.

Nutrition for Kids Snack Program

We understand the important role that nutritious food plays in creating a better learning environment for our students. The Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services has created guidelines that our nutrition program follows to ensure that we are offering your child/children with the best possible food options. In collaboration with our partners, the Community Development Coordinators from the Upper Canada Leger Centre for Education and Training, we ensure that the guidelines are being followed. Our program is overseen and delivered entirely by our dedicated staff who ensure that these snacks are available daily to all students in our school. Currently, we offer a 'Grab and Go' model of delivery in order to follow our COVID-19 protocols. So many students benefit from this program. We all achieve more when we are well-nourished!

Accessibility and Parking at the School

We understand that it is very busy at the end of the day at pick up time. The parking lot is very congested and it can be difficult to find a parking spot. However, it is important that you do not park in the staff parking lot or in a designated accessible parking spot if you do not have a permit. These spots are reserved specifically for vehicles with an accessible parking permit. This is not a request, but the law, and we thank you for your cooperation.

Cell Phones in the Classroom Policy

In November, two years ago, the government mandated a policy for cellphone use in classrooms. This rule applies to all personal electronic devices, which include laptops, cellphones, and any device that can be used to access the internet. These devices are not permitted in the classroom without teacher permission. If/when they are allowed in the classroom, they may only be used for education purposes, special education purposes or medical purposes.

Cell phones and personal electronic devices may not be used on the bus, during recess, or outside at any time as students must be supervised when using them. If these devices are brought to school, the school is not responsible for them if they are lost, damaged or stolen. Students may be required to leave their device at home if they do not adhere to this policy. Students may communicate with their parents by coming to the office, with permission from their teacher.



Student Personal Items at School

We ask for your support in limiting your child's personal items that are brought to school. Students should not bring toys, stuffed animals, trading cards or any other unnecessary personal items to school. We understand that, on occasion, their teacher may allow them to bring something to school for a special event (e.g., stuffie for PJ day or item for Show and Tell). The school is not responsible for these personal items if they are lost, stolen or damaged. Thank you for your support.

Masking for Kindergarten Students

Starting on November 1, Kindergarten students will need to wear a mask while at school. Students will be able to remove their masks for eating, drinking and when they are outside at recess.

Having Kindergarten students wear masks was strongly recommended by both Dr. Paul Roumeliotis, Chief Medical Officer of Health with the Eastern Ontario Health Unit, and Dr. Paula Stewart, Chief Medical Officer of Health for the Leeds, Grenville & Lanark District Health Unit, indicating there are no negative health risks for our youngest students to wear masks and that it will provide them with more protection. Other school boards in our area have taken similar steps.

Sending Invitations to School with Your Child

We recognize that a birthday celebration is an exciting time for a child. However, we ask that you **do not distribute birthday invitations** to a select group of children at the school, to avoid the unintended outcome of some children feeling excluded. Since the school cannot provide you with contact information for confidentiality reasons, please find an alternative way to contact the parents of the children you wish to invite. We thank you for your understanding in this matter.



Our October school council meeting was postponed and our next meeting will occur on Tuesday, November 16th. This meeting will be virtual.
