## Online COVID-19 Screening and Daily Confirmation of **Screening Form**

Thank you so much for completing this screen with your child each morning prior to sending them to school. This Confirmation of Daily Screening form will continue to be in place until further notice. It is so appreciated that you are completing it and signing it daily. This avoids requiring the teacher to take time away from instruction to complete the form if the parent/guardian does not.

#### **Outdoor Recess in Cold Weather**

With our students wearing masks all day, it is so important for them to have a mask-free break at recess. Recess is 40 minutes of free play outside. It is vital that our students come to school prepared with proper winter clothing so they can remain outdoors in cold temperatures for 40 minutes. The following table indicates the expected action for schools based on temperature regarding outdoor routines and recess:

Outdoor Temperature with Wind Chill Factor	Action Regarding Outdoor Routines/Recess	
Up to -20° with wind chill	Regular routine of outdoor recess/activities	
-20° to -25° with wind chill	Principal discretion -may consider shorter outdoor exposure period	
-25° or colder with wind chill	Cancellation of outdoor recess/activities	

It is our practice to closely monitor our students during outdoor play if the temperature reaches these levels with the wind chill. We communicate with our supervising staff via two-way radio and are prepared to bring our students inside at any time if there is an indication that the exposure to the cold is putting our students at risk. Our staff also ensures that students wear the outdoor clothing that is sent with them to school, including snow pants.





Updated COVID-19 School Screening: Many changes have been made to the school screening tool since the fall term. Continue to complete the school screening tool every day to determine if your child should be attending school, and for help on what to do next, or call the Health Unit's phone line at 1-866-236-0123. Changes to School Contact Tracing: Public Health will not be dismissing classroom or bus cohorts after someone at the school has tested positive for COVID-19. If a school's absenteeism rate is 30% above their typical baselines, school administrators and public health will work in partnership to enhance existing public health measures and to provide updates to school families and staff.

Individuals only exposed to a COVID-19 positive individual at school with all public health measures in place are encouraged to monitor themselves for <a href="mailto:symptoms">symptoms</a>. If your child has COVID-19 symptoms or tests positive for COVID-19 on a rapid antigen test or a school PCR self-collection kit, follow the instructions at <a href="mailto:swww.ontario.ca/exposed">www.ontario.ca/exposed</a>.
