- 4. De-streaming Report: This report was presented at the September 38<sup>th</sup> Board meeting. This initiative by the Ministry of Education is being implemented in all our secondary schools. It is based on the principle of equity to support outcomes for all students and foster improved graduation rates and connections to post-secondary institutions. Initial data reflects the intended goal.

#### **PURPOSE:**

Brief discussion of goals and background behind de-streaming of grade 9 courses and implementation strategies to support school staff and students during the transition.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Ontario moved to remove streaming for Grade 9 Math (MTH1W) in the 2021-22 school year and extended this to include the remaining Grade 9 courses in English (ENG1D), Geography (CGC1D), French (FSF1D) and Science (SNC1W).

#### **CONTENT:**

Move to de-stream grade 9 courses is rooted in principles of equity to support outcomes for all students and foster improved graduation rates and connection to post-secondary opportunities.

Ontario was the last province to remove streaming of grade 9 courses.

Initial UCDSB data shows a positive trend for student achievement in de-streamed math compared to previous success rates when streamed.

Connects to the Director's Work Plan with respect to considerations of increasing student achievement and equity of access and outcomes for all students.
