By employing reflective questions such as "What did your child tell you?" and "Did your child's actions solve the problem?" parents can gain insights into the severity of the situation and determine whether further assistance is necessary.

SESSION DURATION

1-hour long and typically focus on a single issue.

Services are offered in English and French. You can request an interpreter (available for 200+ languages including ASL) for a session in your preferred language, before connecting with our therapists.

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SESSION OUTCOME

You receive access to help right away and co-develop an 'action plan' after a therapy session.
